### MAG District Magnitude

San Marino is a single constituency with seats allocated within the country as a whole. The total number of seats (60) is recorded only in rows containing results for all of San Marino.

#### COAL | Coalition Name (Italian)

Beginning in 2008, parties could run as part of a coalition in order to enhance chances of winning a seat bonus awarded to the majority coalition. If a party was part of a coalition, the name of the coalition in Italian is recorded here. Blank for all elections prior to 2008.

#### COAL E Coalition Name (English)

Same as COAL I but coalition name translated into English.

## PTY\_NI Party Name (Italian)

Name of a party or electoral alliance in Italian.

### PTY\_NE Party Name (English)

Same as PTY\_NI but party or electoral alliance name translated into English.

# PTY\_A **Party Abbreviation**

Abbreviation of party or electoral alliance name. Rows with votes for only electoral coalitions listed in COAL\_I and COAL\_E are left blank.

### PEV1 Number of Eligible Voters (First Round)

The number of eligible voters. If there is a runoff election, it indicates the number of eligible voters in the first-round election.

# VOT1 Votes Cast (First Round)

The total number of ballots cast in the first round, including valid and invalid (blank and null) votes. If there is a runoff election, it indicates the number of ballots cast in the first-round election.

### VV1 Valid Votes (First Round)

The total number of valid votes. If there is a runoff election, it indicates the number of valid votes in the first-round election.

### IVV1 Invalid Votes (First Round)

The total number of blank and spoilt ballots. If there is a runoff election, it indicates the total number of blank and spoilt ballots in the first-round election.

# TO1 Turnout (First Round)

The fraction of eligible voters who voted. If there is a runoff election, this indicates the turnout in the first round.

NOTE: This is not a turnout rate reported in an official election report. It is our own calculation from dividing VOT1 by PEV1.

### PV1 Party Votes (First Round)

The total number of votes received by the party or electoral alliance. If there is a runoff election, it indicates the number of votes received in the first-round election.

### PEV2 Number of Eligible Voters (First Round)

The number of eligible voters in the second-round election. If there is no runoff election, this variable is blank.

#### VOT2 Votes Cast (Second Round)

The total number of ballots cast in the second round, including valid and invalid (blank and null) votes. If there is no runoff election, this variable is blank.

# VV2 Valid Votes (Second Round)

The total number of valid votes. If there is no runoff election, this variable is blank.

#### IVV2 Invalid Votes (Second Round)

The total number of blank and spoilt ballots. If there is no runoff election, this variable is blank.

## TO2 Turnout (Second Round)

The fraction of eligible voters who voted. If there is a runoff election, this indicates the turnout in the first round.

# PV2 Party Votes (Second Round)

The total number of votes received by the party or electoral alliance in the runoff. If no runoff was held or the party or electoral alliance did not qualify for it, this variable is blank. Unlike in the first round, voters must cast a ballot for the entire coalition (for multiparty coalitions) rather than an individual party. For the second round, votes are recorded only in the rows coded as "Votes only to the Coalition" in PTY\_N.

#### SEAT Seats Won

The number of seats won by a party or electoral alliance. As San Marino is a single constituency, the variable is blank for rows other than those containing results for the country as a whole.
