## NOTIFICATION

Delimitation of the National Assembly Constituencies, 2017 Draft Issued for Public Information and Comments

The first-ever Final Delimitation Order No. DC/CHAIR/2007/637 was issued on 26<sup>th</sup> of March 2007 by the Delimitation Commission of Bhutan established under Article 24 (4) of the Constitution of the Kingdom of Bhutan. In pursuance of Section 90 of the Election Act of the Kingdom of Bhutan, 2008 requiring review and necessary revision to be carried out after every ten years, the Delimitation Commission notifies the general public as follows:

- 1. Based on the provisions of the Constitution and the Election Act, the Delimitation of Demkhong Rules and Regulations of the Kingdom of Bhutan, 2012 specifically provides that:
  - 4.1. Boundaries shall be drawn so that Demkhongs within a Dzongkhag are, as far as possible, equal in the number of registered voters, resulting in equivalent weight of the votes cast by every voter.

However, other factors prescribed below may also be taken into consideration.

- 4.2. A Demkhong shall correspond, wherever possible, to the existing administrative units and boundaries to facilitate benefits from integration within the territorial area.
- 4.3. The means of communication and travel within a Demkhong needs to be taken into account in delimiting Demkhongs.
- 4.4. Geographical and landmark features such as mountains, rivers and main roads shall be taken into account in delimiting Demkhongs.

4.5. Demkhongs shall be unbroken and inter-connected to facilitate easier interaction of political parties and candidates with their electorates.

- 4.6. The final delimitation process will, as far as possible, take into consideration the size, remoteness as well as sparseness of population
- 7.4 The Delimitation Commission shall, for the allocation of National Assembly Seats, take a total of 10,000 registered voters as the standard size of a National Assembly Demkhong. However, no Dzongkhag shall be allocated less than two and more than seven National Assembly Seats.
- 2. A review exercise has been duly considered by the Delimitation Commission with the registered voter population as of 8<sup>th</sup> of May 2017 taken as the basis, as presented in the *Table 1* below.

- 3. In the first Delimitation Order of 2007, 16 Dzongkhags namely Bumthang, Chhukha, Dagana, Gasa, Haa, Lhuentse, Paro, Punakha, Samdrup Jongkhar, Sarpang, Thimphu, Trashi Yangtse, Trongsa, Tsirang, Wangdue Phodrang and Zhemgang were allocated the minimum of 2 seats each while Monggar and Pema Gatshel were allocated 3 seats each and Samtse and Trashigang were allocated 4 and 5 seats respectively.
- 4. The 16 Dzongkhags had less than 20,000 total Registered Voters in the year 2007. It is found during the review that the voter population in none of these Dzongkhags have reached 30,000 or more, i.e. as of May 2017, thereby not meeting the prescribed standard voter population size criteria.

- 5. Of the 4 Dzongkhags allocated more than 2 NA seats in 2007:
  - (1) Monggar Dzongkhag with registered voter population of 25,579 was allocated 3 seats in 2007 with due regard to the existing administrative boundaries of the 17 gewogs which include remote and inaccessible gewogs. As the registered voter population as of 8<sup>th</sup> May 2017 stands at 32,862 and meets the 10,000 per seat standard requirement, there appears to be no need for any change to the 3 seats currently allocated.
  - (2) Pema Gatshel Dzongkhag with registered voter population of 18,830 was allocated 3 seats in 2007 in consideration of the-then changes in the overall geographical boundary of the Dzongkhag with three Gewogs of Chhoekhorling, Dechhenling and Norboogang under Nganglam Dungkhag of Samdrup Jongkhar Dzongkhag and Nanong Gewog from Trashigang Dzongkhag being merged to Pema Gatshel Dzongkhag. The newly transformed Nganglam Dungkhag was then allocated one seat and the rest of the Gewogs and the newly added Nanong gewog were grouped under two *Demkhongs* to maintain and reflect the existing administrative unit as far as possible.

The total registered voters in Pema Gatshel Dzongkhag as of 8<sup>th</sup> May 2017 is 24,503. By the standard size criterion alone, the existing number of seats could be considered for reduction. However, in view of the implications and consideration of the other criteria related to *Demkhong* boundary corresponding, wherever possible, to existing administrative units and boundaries as well as commonality of interests of communities and the state of accessibility within the Constituency, no change is found necessary.

- (3) Samtse Dzongkhag with registered voter population of 33,349 was allocated 4 seats in 2007 to maintain the contiguity of the existing administrative boundaries and ensure equality of voting strength within the Dzongkhag. As the registered voter population, as of 8<sup>th</sup> May 2017, stands at 44,957 and meets the 10,000 per seat standard requirement, there appears to be no need for any change to the 4 seats currently allocated.
- (4) Trashigang Dzongkhag with a total registered voter population of 33,596 was allocated 5 seats in 2007 to maintain the contiguity of the existing administrative boundaries.

The total registered voters in the Dzongkhag as of 8<sup>th</sup> May 2017 is 44,525. By the standard size criterion alone, the existing number of seats could be considered for reduction. However, considering the implications and with due regard to the other criteria related to *Demkhong* boundary corresponding, wherever possible, to existing administrative units and boundaries as well as the state of accessibility within the Constituency, no change is found necessary.

It is also noted that the total population of Trashigang Dzongkhag is the highest at 74,036 trailed by Samtse Dzongkhag with 66,410.

6. Comparing the total registered voter population of the Dzongkhags, it is found that the voter population of the five Dzongkhags of Chhukha (23,740), Dagana (22,848), Samdrup Jongkhar (23,582), Sarpang (28,734) and Tsirang (24,855) are over 20,000.

However, the registered voter population in these Dzongkhags have not reached the prescribed 30,000 level and no other compelling reasons has emerged or been brought to the notice of the Delimitation Commission to consider increase in the number of seats in these Dzongkhags.

Any change in the number of seats allocated has to be carefully considered in the context of compelling reasons against the implications of foregoing benefits from existing integration of the administrative and the representative units as well as confusion and possible inconvenience to the general public.

The Delimitation Commission, in view of these considerations, proposes to retain the existing numbers and territorial boundaries of the National Assembly Constituencies in the 20 Dzongkhags. The electoral boundary and names of each of the National Assembly Constituencies, drawn in relation with the ground features and the existing Gewog Administrative boundaries, are shown Dzongkhag-wise herein as **Annexure**.

This proposal to maintain, without change, the existing number of seats and territorial boundaries of the National Assembly Constituencies are hereby being issued for information and feedback of the general public as required under the Laws.

Public hearings, open to all registered voters, will be carried out in the 20 Dzongkhags as per the Schedule in *Table 2* below.
