

Report on the General Elections

1969

7. Following the preparation of estimates of polling staff needed, the next step taken in the elections office was to draw up a complete set of equipment which would be needed polling station by polling station. (This list is too long and detailed to include in this report but it is preserved on the elections files for the guidance of anyone who is given the task of organizing future elections). When these lists had been prepared orders for the equipment were placed.

8. It was decided that government officers would not receive special remuneration for acting as election officials. They were paid normal government subsistence and mileage rates and these charges were debited to the departmental vote according to where the officer was employed in government. Non-government officers were paid from the elections vote. Presiding Officers were paid R6.00 per day and polling officers R4.00 per day. Assistant returning officers were paid R4.00 per day for helping to count the votes cast.

9. Various detailed guides were prepared in the elections office. These were —

- (a) Guide to Returning Officers in the parliamentary elections.
- (b) Guide to Returning Officers in the local government elections.
- (c) Guide to Parliamentary Candidates.
- (d) Guide to Local Government Candidates.
- (e) Guide to Presiding Officers in the Parliamentary and Local Government Elections.

A copy of each of these guides is on file in the election office.

10. For the first time in Botswana a Presidential election was held. There had not been such an election before because by virtue of section 32(1) of Chapter IV of the Constitution, the first President of Botswana was the person who, immediately before 30th September, 1966, held the office of Prime Minister.

11. The Presidential elections were conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Presidential Elections (Supplementary Provisions) Act, 1969. The President dissolved Parliament on the 23rd August 1969 and therefore the day fixed for the receipt of nominations was the 13th September, 1969.

12. Authenticating officers were appointed in accordance with section 7 of the act and a list of these officers is attached to this report as appendix C.

13. Three candidates were declared to be validly nominated by the Chief Justice who in terms of the constitution was the returning officer for the Presidential Elections. These were —

- (i) Sir Seretse Khama — Botswana Democratic Party.
- (ii) Ex-Chief Bathoen Gaseitsiwe — Botswana National Front.
- (iii) P.G. Matante — Botswana Peoples Party.

M.K. Mpho, the leader of the Botswana Independence Party failed to secure nomination because he failed to produce the requisite number of support papers.

14. His Excellency the President issued Writs of Election under the Public Seal of Botswana on the 29th August, 1969. On the same day the Minister of Local Government and Lands issued Election Instruments. These writs and instruments directed returning officers in the parliamentary and local government elections to receive nomination of candidates at the various constituency and polling district headquarters between the hours of 9.00 a.m. and 1.00 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and 5.00 p.m. on the 19th September, 1969, and further ordered that any polls which might become necessary would be taken on the 18th October, 1969. The returning officers and the constituency and polling district headquarters are shown in appendices D and E.

15. Nominations were duly received and the lists of candidates nominated in the parliamentary elections and in the local government elections are shown in appendices F and G respectively. In three constituencies, viz Botletle, Serowe North and Moshupa, B.D.P. candi-

dates were returned unopposed and in 46 polling districts B.D.P. candidates were returned unopposed. In the Lobatse farms polling district no candidate was validly nominated on the 19th September. In accordance with regulation 11 of the Local Councils (Conduct of Elections) Regulation 1966 a fresh Election Instrument was issued and a B.D.P. candidate was returned unopposed on the 6th October, 1969.

16. As will be observed from appendices F and G, four parties contested the elections. The parties and the symbols and voting colours which were registered by them in terms of section 149 of the Electoral Act, 1968 were as follows —

There were three independent candidates in the local government elections who selected symbols and voting colours from a list prepared in the elections office.

17. Polling took place on the 18th October, 1969. Polling hours were from 7.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. except in the Kanye North and Kanye south constituencies where the hours were extended to 7.00 p.m. to cater for members of the Seventh Day Adventist Church who could only vote after sunset on polling day which was a Saturday and therefore their sabbath day.

18. In the parliamentary elections the Botswana Democratic Party secured 24 seats, the Botswana National Front 3 seats, the Botswana Peoples Party 3 seats and the Botswana Independence Party 1 seat. On Tuesday 21st October satisfactory evidence was produced to the Chief Justice that of the persons elected to the National Assembly a number being not less than on half of the total number of elected members had declared their support for Sir Seretse Khama as a candidate in the election for President and the Chief Justice therefore declared Sir Seretse Khama to be elected as President of the Republic of Botswana. The President took the oath of office outside Parliament Building Gaborone at 9.00 o'clock a.m. on Wednesday 22nd October, 1969.

19. The results and polling percentages are given in appendix H (parliamentary elections) and appendix I (local government elections).

20. The cost of the elections is shown in appendix J.

Recommendation

21. Despite the care taken over the registration of voters the voters rolls were unsatisfactory. A common complaint was that the numbers on voters registration cards did not correspond with the number on the voters roll. This of course was caused by carelessness on the part of registration officers who put different numbers on the voters registration record cards and voters registration cards. This situation could be prevented from arising in future if the voters registration card was a carbon copy of the relevant part of the voters registration record card. However, I think the best solution would be if the voters registration record cards and the voters registration cards were numbered before being issued and the present system retained whereby the voters registration card is torn off the bottom of the voters registration record cards. In addition it is strongly urged that voters registration record cards are made accountable documents and are bound into bundles of fifty or a hundred before being issued to registration officers.

22. The various methods employed in allocating numbers to voters who registered on supplementary rolls was rather confusing. Thus at some stations the prefix S1 was used for the first supplementary period, S2 for the second and so on. At other stations the prefixes SA, SB

etc. were used. If registration cards were numbered before issue there would be no need to adopt elaborate prefixes and codes which usually confuse registration officers. The numbers could simply follow on in the normal sequence.

23. If this recommendation were adopted a decision would have to be made with regard to numbering. At present the voters roll at each polling station begins at number one but there is no reason why only one series for the country should not be used and different segments in the country series allocated to different polling stations. However, if only for typing convenience, I would recommend that voters rolls for each polling station begin at number one.

24. I think it is desirable that a voter's name be typed in full on the voters rolls and not as at present only the surname and initials indicated. This would mean that more typing time would be needed to prepare the voters roll but I feel that it would be worth it as it would make the recognition of voters easier. In addition I understand that the rigid division into surname and christian name common in Western society is not universally understood in Botswana society so that sometimes it is difficult to decide which is the christian and which the surname of a person applying for registration.

25. Another unsatisfactory feature of the voters rolls was the way in which numbers frequently did not follow on one from the other. Thus the numbers sometimes jumped from 10 to 12 or from 600 to 1000. There were reasons for this. In the case of the smaller gaps mistakes had usually been made by registration officers but in the case of the larger gaps this was caused by registration officers at the bigger polling stations being allocated groups of registration numbers. Thus the officer allocated numbers 1 — 1000 might in fact have registered only 600 voters whilst the second officer had registered a similar number and had numbered them from 1001 upwards. I feel it is desirable that if a number has not been used for any reason an appropriate entry should appear on the voters roll e.g.

21 CANCELLED; or

600 — 1000 NO REGISTRATIONS UNDER THESE NUMBERS.

26. There are some provisions of the Electoral Act, 1968 and of the Local Councils (Conduct of Elections) Regulations which in my view should be amended. These are —

- (a) Section 32 (1) of the Electoral Act, 1968 and the corresponding regulation in the Local Councils (Conduct of Elections) Regulations, 1966 — I feel that the prospective candidate should be registered on an election roll as well as the proposer, seconder and supporters and the nomination paper should be amended to require the candidate to state the number under which he is registered on the election roll.
- (b) Section 52 and 70(e) of the Electoral Act and the corresponding regulation in the local government election regulations — I think the requirement that ballot envelopes must be stamped with the official mark should be abolished. It does little to prevent forgery of envelopes since anyone who acquired a forged envelope would probably find it just as easy to acquire or manufacture a stamp. It seems wrong that a person can be deprived of his vote simply because a careless polling officer forgets to stamp a ballot envelope.
- (c) Section 60(5) of the Electoral Act provides for a polling officer or police officer on duty at a polling station other than the polling station where he is registered as a voter, to be entitled to vote at his duty polling station provided both polling stations are in the same constituency. The equivalent provision in the Local Councils (Conduct of Elections) Regulations 1966 is to be found in regulation 33 (5) but is naturally more restrictive as both polling stations have to be in the same polling district. These restrictions did not cause undue difficulties in the 1969 elections because the majority of presiding officers were appointed from expatriate govern-

ment officers who were not qualified to register as voters. However, as the public service becomes more localised this will cause a problem as officers might be reluctant to accept appointment as presiding or polling officers if this would entail their losing their vote. I recommend that the legislation be amended so as to make provision for polling and police officers to be allowed to vote at the polling station where they are registered before they proceed on election duties provided such station is at or near their government duty station.

(d) Section 91(a) of the Electoral Act, 1968 and the corresponding regulation in the local government regulations — treating as defined excludes the provision of food or drink. I think the definition should include them.

(e) Section 92 in the Electoral Act, 1968 and the corresponding provision in the local government regulation — it is for consideration whether the definition of undue influence should not be widened so as to make it an offence for anyone holding a public office or occupying a post of traditional authority (e.g. headman, subordinate tribal authority or tribal authority) to urge people to vote for any particular candidate.

27. I consider that the Presidential Elections (Supplementary Provisions) Act, 1969 should be amended so as to make it necessary for a candidate for election to the office of President to be registered on an election roll and to require him to declare the number under which he is registered on his nomination paper. As the act stands it seems that a candidate need only be registered as a voter but if his name does not appear on an election roll the returning officer could not in fact check that he was registered.

28. I consider the Presidential Elections (Supplementary Provisions) Act, 1969 should be further amended to make it clear that a presidential candidate need not attend in person to submit his nomination and support papers but can cause such papers to be handed to the returning officer on his behalf.

29. A matter which in my view merits consideration is the need for candidates in parliamentary elections to produce a certificate of proficiency in English. It must be somewhat humiliating for an educated person to have to apply for a certificate that he is proficient in English, especially when the applicant is better educated than the person authorised to issue such a certificate. After all, a prospective candidate does not have to produce a certificate that he is not insane or that he is not a bankrupt. I feel proficiency in English should be a requirement for membership of the legislature but that nonproficiency should be grounds for removing a person from the legislature and not of preventing him from standing. I realise, of course, that a person being sane when elected can become insane whereas it is unlikely that being proficient in English he could, a short while later, lose this proficiency, but I still think we could be less "colonial" in our constitution.

30. The possibility of double voting was raised after the elections. There was no evidence that double voting had taken place but it was pointed out that it was possible for such voting to occur. In the first elections held in 1965 such voting would have been easier to detect because centres like Gaborone and Lobatse had only one polling station each. Therefore, polling agents could have identified people who were attempting to vote twice at the same polling station. But with the creation of polling districts for the purposes of local government elections, eleven polling stations were created in Lobatse and nine in Gaborone. Obviously in such circumstances it would be fairly easy for a person to be registered at more than one polling station and to vote more than once.

31. If double voting is thought to have occurred or if it appears that it might occur in the future, then the obvious thing to do is to adopt measures to make it easy to identify people who have voted. In Zambia and Kenya this is done by requiring people to insert their thumb in

indelible dye before they are permitted to vote. Such a system seems to be the only method of preventing double voting. I think it is rather degrading to subject people to such a procedure but if it is feared that double voting might take place frequently it might be necessary to introduce such a system in Botswana.

32. The actual polling arrangements were reasonably satisfactory. Some voters made the mistake of putting their ballot envelopes in the discard box. The slit in the discard boxes could, in future, be made so small that they could not admit the ballot envelope which in addition could be made bigger than in the 1969 election. This is not entirely satisfactory since if the hole in the discard box is too small the voters might find it difficult to discard their unwanted voting squares and even when presiding officers made the slit in the discard tin smaller by partly covering it with sellotape, voters persisted, in some cases, in folding up their ballot envelopes and inserting them in the discard tin. However, I think the answer is to make the slit in the discard tin smaller and to amend the Electoral Act and the local government elections regulations to make it clear that ballot envelopes inserted in the discard tin can be treated as spoilt votes. This is in fact what many presiding officers did but such a practice is not strictly in accordance with the law.

33. In future care should be taken to ensure that ballot envelopes are made of opaque paper. The ballot envelopes used in the parliamentary elections were made of good quality paper and were in fact tested with a yellow voting square. However, when red or black voting squares were inserted in the envelopes it was possible if they were held against the light to detect the colour of the disc through the envelope. I am certain that this had no effect on the results of the poll since there is no evidence to suggest that voters realised this fault. The fault was more obvious to returning officers who counted the envelopes under electric lights. But, nevertheless, in future elections I suggest white ballot envelopes should not be used and brown envelopes should be used instead, possibly overprinted with some suitable words or design to distinguish them from envelopes used for local government elections.

34. I think the election arrangements on the whole were successful. The poll was not as high as it was in 1965 but I do not feel that it would be profitable for me to speculate on the reasons for this. However, I think that one factor should be borne in mind in future elections and that is the need to give adequate time for a thorough pre-election publicity campaign to be carried out. Information teams did a fine job in the 1969 elections but they simply did not have the time to mount a really intensive campaign. Botswana is a large country and the six information teams which were available could not give adequate coverage in six to seven weeks. I think it is necessary also to mount bigger publicity campaigns to urge people to register as voters say about a year before the anticipated election date as this serves to make people aware of elections and, of course, swells the numbers of people who register.

CONCLUSION

35. I would like to record my thanks to all officers who assisted with the election arrangements. Except in a few cases most government officers co-operated wholeheartedly and without their assistance the elections would not have been as successful as they were.

36. I would like to record my thanks to the Commissioner of the Botswana Police and to members of his force who assisted in so many ways too numerous to mention.

37. I would also like to record my thanks to the Government Printer and his staff who never failed to produce what was required at the right time. Without the willing and efficient assistance rendered by these officers it would have been difficult to organise the elections successfully.
