Sir.

I have the honour to submit to you a Report on the conduct of the 1974 General Parliamentary Election as required of me by Section 66(5) of the Constitution of the Republic of Botswana, I am including in this Report an account of the organisation of the 1974 Local Government Elections since the two elections were run concurrently using, as far as possible, the same staff. A second reason for doing this is to ensure that the detailed results of the Local Government Elections become generally available to the public.

2. The Report itself consists of two sections. The first is primarily an account of the Elections, the second an evalu-

ation of the Elections and their organisation with suggestions for improving the electoral procedure.

3. The National Assembly was dissolved by His Excellency Sir Seretse Khama on August 30th, 1974, and on September 6th, 1974, he issued Writs of Election for each of the thirty-two constituencies. In these Writs he declared September 27th as Nomination Day and October 26th as Polling Day for all constituencies in which there was a contest. On the same day, the Minister of Local Government and Lands issued 176 Election Instruments for the nomination and election of representatives to all Town and District Councils, in which he specified the same days

for Nomination and Polling as those for the Parliamentary Election.

4. In terms of the Presidential Elections (Supplementary Provisions) Act, Nomination Day for Presidential Candidates is the first Saturday following the expiry of 20 days after the dissolution of the National Assembly, which was Saturday, September 21st, 1974. As soon as the National Assembly was dissolved, authenticating officers for the Presidential nomination were gazetted. A list of all authenticating officers is included at Appendix "B". The list consisted of all District Commissioners, District Officers, Station Commanders or Post Commanders of Police to ensure a wide distribution of places where nomination papers could be authenticated. Returning Officers to both the Parliamentary and Local Government were also appointed and trained as soon as the National Assembly was dissolved. A list of Returning Officers for the Parliamentary Elections is included at Appendix "C", and one of Returning Officers for the Local Government Elections at Appendix "D".

5. Presidential nominations were received at the High Court in Lobatse by the Chief Justice. Two candidates

submitted their nominations and were declared validly nominated:

(i) Sir Seretse Khama of the Botswana Democratic Party;

(ii) Bathoen Gaseitsiwe of the Botswana National Front.

6. I published Supplementary Voters Rolls on July 31st, 1974. No registrations which had not been submitted to me by that date were valid for the 1974 Election. Registration was heavy up to and immediately following this date. As soon as I had certified the Rolls on 28th August, 1974, Elections staff checked the Voters Rolls and counted the number of voters who would be eligible to vote in the coming Election. There were a total of 80 315 new registrations between the closing of the Rolls for the previous General Election in June, 1969 and July 31st, 1974, bringing the total number of names on the Roll to 236 848. There were no new registrations of aliens.

7. As soon as this task had been completed, staff requirements were estimated for each Polling Station, using the same basis for these estimates as used in the last General Election, i.e. that 600 voters could comfortably be handled by two Polling Officers and that eight Polling Officers could be supervised by one Presiding Officer. Staff requirements were then submitted to District Commissioners. District Commissioners were requested to recommend all Polling Officers for appointment and to provide the names of as many Presiding Officers as possible from Districts in order to minimise transport requirements. These names were submitted to the Elections office where the staff list was completed by drawing upon Government staff based in Gaborone. Letters were then sent out to all Presiding Officers on this list informing them that it was intended to appoint them to a particular Polling Station and asking for their comments, so that re-allocations or replacements could be made as necessary.

8. On Nomination Day a total of 63 candidates were validly nominated for election to the National Assembly. The Botswana Democratic Party nominated candidates in all 32 constituencies, four of whom were unopposed. The Botswana Independent Party nominated six candidates, the Botswana National Front, fourteen, and the Botswana People's Party, eight. There were three Independent candidates. There were 362 candidates for the 176 Local Government Polling Districts, and sixty-six of the Polling Districts were uncontested. A summary of the total number

of Local Government candidates standing, according to their Party, is included at Appendix "G".

9. Returning Officers had been requested to send in all nominations to the Elections office as soon as possible after the close of nominations and by 9.30 p.m. virtually all nominations had been submitted. This information enabled final planning for packing of ballot boxes. A duplicate list of all equipment required for each Polling Station was prepared to ensure that the equipment packed for that Polling Station was correct. It proved possible to pack between 100 and 140 ballot boxes a day once these forms had been prepared, using two staff from the Elections office and nine daily-paid labourers. This job was spread over two weeks, during which time staff lists were finalised and outdoor booths for Polling Stations without buildings were delivered to all but the nearest of these. Ballot boxes and indoor polling booths were then either delivered to District Headquarters for issue by District Commissioners, or retained for issue direct to Presiding Officers who were leaving from Gaborone.

10. Training of Elections staff and provision of information for candidates for the public occupied a consideranle amount of time of the Elections office staff. Five Guides were issued, copies of each are lodged in the Government

Archives:

A Guide to Authenticating Officers

A Guide to Returning Officers for the Parliamentary and Local Government Elections

A Guide to Presiding Officers in the Parliamentary and Local Government Elections

A Guide to Candidates for the Parliamentary Election

A Guide to Candidates for the Local Government Election.

In addition, two series of courses were conducted. Courses for Returning Officers were held at Tshabong, Ghanzi, Maun, Kasane, Francistown, Serowe and Gaborone before Nomination Day and as soon as staff lists were completed, a set of courses were held for Presiding Officers. The help of two people outside the Elections office was enlisted for this series, which included courses as follows:

Ghanzi Kasane Francistown Selebi-Pikwe Serowe Mahalapye Mochudi (2) Molepolole Gaborone (8)

11. In the Report of the General Election, 1969 it was noted that training of Polling Officers for which responsibility had been allocated to District Commissioners, had been unsatisfactory. As a result, it was decided that each Presiding Officer should be made responsible for training his own Polling Officers. Presiding Officers were advised to arrive at their station the afternoon before Polling Day to marshall their staff and organise their station. This arrangement for training proved satisfactory where Presiding Officers did in fact arrive early, although in a few

12. It was decided that the Government information campaign for the election should be restricted to informing voters how to choose a candidate and how to vote. Information assistants from the Information Department toured the whole country holding kgotla meetings. They informed people when election day would be, told them how to vote, and answered questions on registration. A series of short conversations between characters were written by Radio Botswana staff on topics selected by elections staff, and then checked by the Elections Office. The 16 odd short programmes, each on a single topic, were broadcast a number of times to ensure that the message was communicated to the listening public.

13. Polling took place on Saturday, October 26th, 1974. The Polling Stations opened at 7.00 a.m. and closed at 6.00 p.m. except in Kanye North, Kanye South and Moshupa constituencies, where polls did not close until 7.00 p.m. to cater for members of the Seventh Day Adventist Church which would not allow its members to vote until after 6.00 p.m. In all, 64 011 people voted in the Parliamentary Elections of the 205 050 voters on the Rolls in contested constituencies, a polling percentage of 31,2%.

14. In the contested Parliamentary constituencies, the Botswana Democratic Party gained twenty-three seats, the Botswana Independence Party gained one seat, and the Botswana National Front and Botswana People's Parties

15. On Monday, 28th October, I officially informed the Chief Justice, the Returning Officer for the Presidential Election, that more than half of the successful elected members of the National Assembly had declared their support for Sir Seretse Khama as President of Botswana, and he was duly declared re-elected by the Chief Justice on that day, The President took the Oath of Office on Tuesday, 29th October, 1974. 16. Details of the results of the Parliamentary Elections are included at Appendix "F", and results of the Local

Government Elections are given in Appendix "H".

Evaluation and Recommendations

17. The most striking figure emerging from the Elections is the low polling percentage. It has not been possible for me to conduct any detailed investigation into the reasons for this, but some analysis can be attempted and pre-

18. If it is assumed that those who registered as voters were evenly distributed amongst the total population eligible to register, then an estimate can be made of those who registered before 1969 and who now are dead by using life tables derived from the 1971 Census. This is a conservative estimate as it does not take account of those who had registered and died before the 1968 elections. An analysis, using these tables, indicates that approximately 12 500 of those who registered in 1969 are now dead, and that the voting percentage was, in fact, about 33,5.

19. Using the 1971 Census, it is also possible to estimate the total number of people who were eligible to vote: a total of approximately 239 500. There are 236 838 names on the Voters Rolls, and the Elections office has the names of approximately 200 people who registered but who were too late to be included on the election rolls: a total of nearly 239 000 names. It is extremely unlikely that Botswana has achieved 100% registration. It would appear that there has been some double registration, since the last General Election in 1969, and thus the percentage turnout of those registered to vote was, in fact, over 33,5.

20. There is no way of estimating the true percentage of those who are eligible to vote who actually registered. The following are suggested as likely figures to show their implications on the actual turnout: If 90% of those eligible to vote had registered, this would mean that there were 21 000 double registrations and that 37% of the electorate did, in fact, vote. It is more likely that only 80% of those eligible had, in fact, registered, in which case 42% of the electorate voted.

21. The reason for such extensive double registration can only be guessed at. There is absolutely no evidence at hand that there was only double voting. It would appear, therefore, that many registered voters thought that cards used in the last general election were no longer valid. This is quite likely as this misinformation was widespread at one point during the supplementary registration campaign.

22. Even, if, as these figures show, the Poll was significantly higher than 33,5% of those actually registered, the fact remains that only one third of those who could have voted did so. This is an unsatisfactory turnout when compared to other parts of the world and I think it is a matter which deserves some attention. By definition, a democracy is dependent upon the involvement of its citizens in the political process, and I therefore recommend that the reasons for the low poll be investigated and that action be taken to improve the political involvement of the population in

23. The evidence that there is double registration indicates that the voters rolls are in an unsatisfactory state. The most common difficulty at every Polling Station in Botswana on Election Day was that the rolls were incorrect. It is obvious that a complete re-registration must take place before the next General Election and in this regard, the recommendations made in the Report on the General Elections 1969, are fully supported. In short, these are that registration cards should be pre-numbered and made accountable documents, a system should be devised so that the name of a voter has to be written only once by the Registration Officer, and a carbon copy sent to the Elections office, and that voters' names should be recorded in full on the Voters Rolls. The latter is important, not only to avoid confusion on Election Day, but also to enable Registration Officers to issue duplicates. There have been several cases where people with common names requested duplicates and it has been impossible to distinguish their registration number from several registered voters with the same surname and initials.

24. The quality of registration information finally depends upon the quality of the staff responsible for registering voters and compiling Voters Rolls. As far as possible, re-registration should be carried out by competent officers

specially trained for the purpose, to ensure that the new roll is accurate.

25. Before a complete re-registration is embarked upon, there should be a thorough checking of all Polling Stations. Some outdoor stations could now be housed in buildings which have been built recently. Some indoor stations could be better housed. There are also a few cases where the names of Polling Stations should be altered. A thorough check will be time consuming and should be begun as soon as possible.

26. Nomination Day was well-organised from the point of view of the Elections office and went off smoothly. There were, however, a number of complaints that signatures of supporters on nomination papers had been forged. All complaints received by the Elections office were referred directly to the Police for investigation. Forgery of nomination papers does not threaten the election system as it is unlikely that a candidate who is unable to garner nine supporters will win the Election. Should he or she do so, an Election Petition could still be brought before the High Court. I recommend that the Electoral Act be amended to require either a signature or a thumbprint on nomination papers, and to disbar crosses in lieu of signatures.

27. The experience of two General Elections since Independence indicates that there are several amendments which should be made to the voting procedure. The most simple is that the requirement that Ballot Envelopes should be stamped with an official mark as required by Section 52 (ϵ) (i) in the Electoral Act and the equivalent provision in the Local Councils (Conduct of Elections) Regulations should be abolished. This system of marking envelopes immediately prior to a voter voting is to ensure that envelopes are not deposited into the Ballot Box illegaly. It is only a double check, however, as all envelopes issued by the Elections office are numbered and an account is kept of the numbers on every envelope dispatched to each polling station. Provided a strict check is kept on the Ballot Envelope account, it is completely unnecessary to mark the envelopes at the time of voting. In both General Elections a number of Presiding Officers have neglected to stamp envelopes with the official mark. This presents Returning Officers with a difficult decision and can disenfranchise numbers of voters through no fault of their own.

28. A second recommendation is that envelopes accidentally inserted into the discard tin by voters should be counted as spoilt votes, that a second envelope should be issued in their place, and that the envelope in the discard tin should be accounted for. This recommendation was also made in the Report on the General Elections 1969. 29. The final recommendation to be made has more wide-reaching implications. This is that Section 52 (c) (iii) of the Electoral Act and the equivalent Local Council regulation, which states that "the number of the Ballot Envelope shall be endorsed on the copy of the Electoral Roll against the number of such voter" should be abolished. The voting system is so designed that the High Court of Botswana, should it find it necessary to do so, can determine how a particular voter voted. This is to enable it to pass judgment on a case where a voter states he voted for a particular candidate, and alleges that the disc in his envelope was substituted for one of another colour.

30. There are checks against identification of an individual's vote by anyone other than the High Court. Numbered voters rolls are sealed at the close of Poll. Ballots are sealed separately immediately after the count, and both are kept sealed under the custody of the High Court until they are destroyed. In some cases neither Ballots nor Voters Rolls are properly sealed through human error however, and the opportunity could arise where a particular person's ballot could be identified by some unauthorised person. The question therefore arises as to whether it is more important to be able to check the ballot of a particular person if there is an Election Regulation or whether the Act should be amended to ensure that it is impossible to compromise the secrecy of any person's vote. I recommend that the ballot should become completely secret. There is evidence that some people who were registered did not vote because of the provision in this Section, and there seems to be little chance that the High Court will ever need to check a particular person's vote. Counted Ballots should still be kept so that they can be examined to see that there are no illegal envelopes amongst them, or so that they can be recounted.

31. The amendments in the voting procedure suggested should significantly increase the speed at which voters can be processed. This factor is not important where there are low polls, but should there be a marked increase in political participation, this might become important. I do not think that the proposed amendments increase the chance of the introduction of corrupt practices, or decrease the chances of their detection should they occur.

32. A recommendation made in the Report on the General Elections, 1969, was that provisions should be made in the Electoral Act which would enable Presiding Officers and Polling Officers who were working outside their own Polling Districts or constituency, to cast an absentee vote. A number of public officers complained about being deprived of their vote during this election, and I recommend that provisions be made which will allow these people to vote. It is unlikely that there will ever be very many of them, and they will nearly always all be from large centres, so administration of such a provision will not be complicated.

33. I recommend that the Supervisor of Elections be empowered to designate a day, and hours, during which absentee voting for elections staff will take place. Ballots should be placed into envelopes rather than boxes, which

would then be sealed and despatched to the Returning Officers for the constituencies or polling districts in which those votes are to be counted, and opened at the time of the main count.

34. The most unsatisfactory aspect of Polling Day was the packing up of the Polling Stations at the close of poll, and

the sealing and labelling of the separate packages. For this election, I provided envelopes which were to be sealed and labelled. In many cases, sealed envelopes and boxes were left completely unmarked, causing difficulties for both Returning Officers and Elections office staff. A considerable degree of confusion could be eliminated by providing pre-marked envelopes and possibly by improving the directions in the Guide to Presiding Officers.

35. The ballot count was completed quickly in this Election. All results were in to me by 9.30 p.m. on Sunday, October 27th. This was only achieved because Returning Officers and their assistants worked throughout the night. Most of the counting staff had already worked a long day as Presiding Officers and were extremely tired. In future, it would be preferable if separate staff could be specially appointed to help count the poll. The Guide to Returning Officers also needs to be modified to give more detailed instructions to Returning Officers on the conduct of the count. Finally, the only equipment provided for the Elections which proved unsatisfactory were the staplers provided for the count. In future, Returning Officers must be provided with special heavy-duty ones.

36. I consider that three amendments should be made to the Presidential Elections (Supplementary Provisions)

36. I consider that three amendments should be made to the Presidential Elections (Supplementary Provisions) Act, 1969. The first is to make it necessary for a candidate for election to the office of President to be registered on an election roll and to require him to declare the number under which he is registered on his nomination paper. The second is to remove the need for the presidential candidate to attend in person to submit his nomination and support papers and to enable him to cause such papers to be handed to the Returning Officer on his behalf. The last suggested amendment is to enable the Returning Officer to declare a presidential candidate nominated as soon as he is satisfied that the candidate has complied with the requirements of Section 5 of the Act and he has counted not less than 998 authenticated support papers. The existing provision requires the Returning Officer to wait until 5 p.m. on Nomination Day before he can declare a candidate to be validly nominated.

Conclusion

37. I would like to record my thanks to all the public officers, teachers and private individuals who assisted with the election arrangements. With a few exceptions, public officers co-operated whole-heartedly and without their assistance the elections would not have been as successful as they were.

38. In particular, I would also like to record my thanks to the Commissioner of Police, to members of the Botswana Police and to the Government Printer and his staff who never failed to provide the assistance required from them. Mr A. Seager, who was once again seconded from the Ministry of Agriculture to be responsible for much of the planning and organisation of the Election arrangements, deserves a special mention for his tireless and good natured approach to his duties.
