- "(b) MZIMBA EAST: which is the part of the Mzimba District and comprises the whole of MZUZU TOWNSHIP, LIPASO/CHOMA, EKWENDENI including EKWENDENI MISSION STATION, NJUYU and CHIGUDE;
- (c) MZIMBA WEST: (re-named; previously Mzimba North), which is the Western part of Mzimba District and comprises the areas of CHIEF MPHEREMBE, the Southern part of CHIEF MTWALO which includes KAFUKULE, LOVWELE, CHINKYELA, JANDALALA and KAPEMBELWA".

We have the honour to present our report on the Delimitation of Constituencies. Your Excellency announced in Parliament on 27th March, 1975, that Your Excellency had given approval that in this year's General Elections all the Districts, except Mwanza will have one additional Constituency. We therefore set out for another country tour from August to December last year. Our main purpose during the tour this time was to delimit constituencies in order to accommodate the new additional constituencies.

2. We also took the opportunity to look at the present constituency boundaries and where necessary adjusted them according to geographical and communication considerations.

3. During the tour we kept ourselves mindful of the terms of reference, the most important ones being that:-

- (a) as far as possible each constituency should be so delimited as to comprise one or more registration sub-districts (Municipal or Council Ward) and that unless there are special reasons to the contrary no sub-district should be divided between constituencies;
- (b) all constituencies should be delimited to conform, in general, to the boundaries of administrative districts and unless there are special reasons to the contrary a constituency boundary should not transgress the boundary of an administrative district;
- (c) in describing a constituency, the Chief and Sub-Chief's areas will be listed as contained in each constituency.

The Minister Responsible for Parliamentary Elections informed us that Your Excellency had also approved an additional constituency for Mwanza District after the people of Mwanza had made representations.

4. We had a successful tour and wish to record below a comparison between the present number of constituencies and what the position will be during the General Elections this year:-

MAIN REPORT OF THE ELECTORAL COMMISSION ON DELIMITATION OF  
CONSTITUENCIES, 1975

10. We resumed our task of touring the whole country again in August, 1975, following the announcement by Your Excellency that each District was given an additional constituency in preparation for this year's General Elections. Our tour programme had to be disturbed **more than once** because of the heavy national programme during the period of this tour, for example, in September it had to break off in view of the Annual Convention of the Malaŵi Congress Party and had to break off again in October due to the State Opening of Parliament.

11. We started our tour with the Northern Region and came down to the Central Region and finished with the Southern Region. We visited all the Districts in the country and according to the tour programme shown at Appendix 'B' of this Report, we had firstly to visit the proposed areas where the new constituencies will be located and then after that discussed our findings with the Local Leaders. We reminded all the Leaders in each district as regards our Terms of Reference and advised them that in considering constituency boundaries, we always ensure that as far as possible constituencies should be delimited as to comprise one or more registration sub-districts and unless there are special reasons to the contrary, no registration sub-district (Municipal or Council Ward) should be **divided** between constituencies. We also advised the Leaders that constituencies will be delimited to conform to the boundaries of administrative districts and unless there were special reasons to the contrary the constituency boundaries should not transgress administrative districts.

12. In every district where we went the leaders were further asked to make any suggestions as to how they wished the new constituencies to be demarcated, and our recommendations on how the constituencies in the country should now be demarcated have been included in the Main Report that follows. It is however necessary at this point to cite a number of cases affecting constituencies whose boundaries have not been demarcated in strict conformity with the Terms of Reference of the Commission and these constituencies are detailed below. It is necessary to remember that where it has been possible in most cases to demarcate constituency boundaries with geographical, population and communication considerations in mind, in some cases it has not been easy to strictly adhere to these considerations. The following constituencies have been affected as a result of this:-

(a) Dowa Central and Dowa East Constituencies

We found it necessary to split Sub-Chief Mkukula's area in two sections, one to the east and the other to the centre because there is already a proposal by the Dowa District Council to split this area in two Council Wards.

(b) Ntcheu West and South Constituencies

We found that the area under Village Headman Chabwela in Chief Phambala's area should, for communication reasons, be part of the western constituency as this area is on a hilly place but far from the southern constituency boundary.

(c) Mwanza and Neno Constituencies

We found that the area under Village Headman Chikalema in the western constituency is very isolated but that it is very close to the eastern constituency. We therefore felt that this area should be included in the eastern constituency for ease of communication.

13. Having visited all these areas we felt that the District Council Wards are at present delimited in such a way that within our terms of reference we could not operate without disturbing the Wards. We feel that there is need for the Ministry of Local Government to look into some of the present District Council Wards.

14. We now wish to describe our recommendations regarding the new constituencies and constituency boundaries.

CHITIPA

Number of Registered Voters - 41,057

15. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the Leaders. We wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Chitipa District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Chitipa East

The eastern part of Chitipa District comprising the whole area of Chief Mwenemisuku.

(b) Chitipa North

The northern part of Chitipa District comprising the areas of Chief Mwaulambya and Chief Kameme.

(c) Chitipa South

The southern part of Chitipa District comprising the areas of Chief Mwenewenya and Chief Nthalire.

KARONGA

Number of Registered Voters - 80,771

16. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the Leaders.

The Leaders gave various suggestions regarding the new constituency boundaries. Some favoured that the northern constituency should start from Ngana/Songwe river to Nchobo stream, the central constituency from Nchobo stream to Gumi stream and the southern constituency from Gumi stream to Chitimba river, but others thought that the northern constituency should start from Ngana/Songwe river to Lufirya and the central constituency from Lufirya to Kasimba stream and the southern constituency from Kasimba stream to Chitimba river.

17. Having taken all the arguments into consideration, we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Karonga should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Karonga North

The northern part of Karonga District comprising the areas of Chief Kilupula and Sub-Chief Mwakaboko.

(b) Karonga Central

The central part of Karonga District comprising the areas of Chief Kyungu and Sub-Chief Karonga.

(c) Karonga South

The southern part of Karonga District comprising the areas of Sub-Chief Mwirang'ombe and Chief Mwafulirwa.

RUMPHI

Number of Registered Voters - 39,827

18. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the Leaders. The Leaders gave various suggestions as regards the demarcation of the new constituency.

19. Having taken all the arguments into consideration we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Rumphu District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Rumphu East

The eastern part of Rumphu District comprising the whole areas of Chief Mwamlowe, Sub-Chiefs Chapinduka, Mwalweni and Kachulu including Livingstonia Mission Station.

(b) Rumphu Central

The Central part of Rumphu District comprising the whole areas of Sub-Chief Mwahenga, Sub-Chief Mwankhunikila and part of Chief Chikulamayembe's own administrative area which is in the Henga Valley including the Boma area up to Lunyina River.

(c) Rumphu West

The western part of Rumphu District comprising the remaining area of Chief Chikulamayembe's

MZIMBA

Number of Registered Voters - 137,816

20. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the Leaders. The Leaders gave various suggestions regarding the demarcation of the new constituency.

21. Having taken all the arguments into consideration, we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Mzimba District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Mzimba North (re-named, previously Mzimba North-East)

The northern part of Mzimba District comprising the area of Sub-Chief Jaravikuba and the central part of Chief Mtwalo.

(b) Mzimba East

The eastern part of Mzimba District comprising the whole of Mzuzu Township, Lupaso/Choma, Ekwendeni areas including Ekwendeni Mission Station.

(c) Mzimba West (re-named, previously Mzimba North)

The western part of Mzimba District comprising the areas of Chief Mpherembe and the southern part

of Chief Mtwalo which include Chigude, Njuyu and Kafukule areas.

(d) Mzimba Central

The central part of Mzimba District comprising the area of Chief Chinde and that part of the area of Sub-Chief Samson Sibande which lies to the south and west of the Mozera and Kasitu Rivers respectively, but excluding any part of the Mzimba Government Forest Reserve.

(e) Mzimba South

The southern part of Mzimba District comprising the areas of Chief M'mbelwa, Chief Mzukuzuku, Mzimba Government Forest Reserve and that part of Chief Mzikubola's area which excludes the eastern part of the main road from Kasungu to Mzimba and Katete Mission area.

(d) Mzimba South-East

The south-eastern part of Mzimba District comprising the whole area of Chief Mabulabo in the extreme south-east of Mzimba and that part of Chief Mzikubola comprising Katete Mission area, Champira and Makongera Village joining the district boundary near Lupache stream in the north.

NKHATA BAY

Number of Registered Voters - 81,816

22. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the Leaders. The Leaders gave various proposals as regards demarcation of the new constituency.

23. Having taken all the arguments into consideration, we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituency in Nkhata Bay District should be demarcated as follows:-

(a) Nkhata Bay North

The northern part of Nkhata Bay District comprising the areas of Sub-Chief Mkondowe, Chief Boghoyo and Chief Musisya.

(b) Nkhata Bay Central

The central part of Nkhata Bay District comprising the areas of Chief Timbiri, Chief Mankhambira, Chief Kabunduli, Sub-Chief Mkumbira and Sub-Chief Fukamalaza.

(c) Nkhata Bay South

The southern part of Nkhata Bay District comprising the areas of Chief Fukamapiri, Chief Malenga Mzoma, Sub-Chief Zilakoma and the two Islands of Likoma and Chizumulo under Chief Mpima.

KASUNGU

Number of Registered Voters - 110,737

24. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the Leaders.

Some Leaders suggested that the boundary between the proposed Kasungu North and Kasungu North-West Constituencies should be Lilongwe-Mzimba road and other leaders suggested that the whole area of Chief Kaluluma including the areas of his Sub-Chiefs should form a constituency and that the whole area of Chief Chulu should form another constituency. Having considered the geographical position of the area and its communication, we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Kasungu District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Kasungu North

The northern part of Kasungu District comprising the areas of Sub-Chief Chisikwa, Chief Kaluluma and Sub-Chief Simulemba.

(b) Kasungu North-West

The north-western part of Kasungu District comprising the areas of Chief Chulu and Sub-Chief Mnyanja.

(c) Kasungu West

The western part of Kasungu District comprising the whole area of Chief Kaomba's own administration; the whole area of Kasungu Township or Boma Area (whose boundaries are Chitete Stream in the east, Kabvunguti Bridge in the south and Chankanga Stream in the north), and the northern part of the area of Sub-Chief Kawamba lying north of the Kasungu/Mchinji road.

The boundary between the east and west constituencies should be a line drawn along the existing boundary between the area of Chief Kaomba and Chief Wimbe excluding that part of Chief Wimbe's area now under Kasungu Township west of Chitete/Kabvunguti stream.

(d) Kasungu East

The eastern part of Kasungu District comprising the whole areas of Chief Kapelula, Chief Wimbe and that part of the area of Sub-Chief Chilowamatani lying north of the Kasungu/Nkhotakota road. The boundary between the east and south constituencies should be a line drawn along the Kasungu/Nkhotakota road.

(e) Kasungu South

The southern part of Kasungu District comprising the whole areas of Chief Santhe and Sub-Chief Njombwa; and that part of the area of Sub-Chief Kawamba lying south of the Kasungu/Mchinji road including that part of the area of Chief Kaomba; south of the Kasungu/Mchinji road and Kasungu/Nkhotakota road, excluding the Kasungu Township area. The boundary between the west and south constituencies should be a line drawn along the existing Kasungu/<sup>Mchinji</sup>Nkhotakota road.

NKHOTAKOTA

Number of Registered Voters - 55,961

25. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the leaders. The leaders gave various suggestions as regards the demarcation of the new constituency boundary. Having considered the arguments, we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Nkhotakota District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Nkhotakota North

The northern part of Nkhotakota District comprising the whole area of Chief Kanyenda, Sub-Chief Kafuzira and Sub-Chief Mphonde.

(b) Nkhotakota Central

The central part of Nkhotakota District comprising the whole area of Chief Malengachanzi.

(c) Nkhotakota South

The southern part of Nkhotakota District comprising the whole areas of Chief Mwadzama and Sub-Chief Mwansambo.

NTCHISI

Number of Registered Voters - 79,251

26. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency which would split the District into two constituencies.

and later held discussion with the leaders. The leaders gave various suggestions as regards the demarcation of the new constituency. Having considered the arguments, we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Ntchisi District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Ntchisi West

The western part of Ntchisi District comprising the areas of Chief Kalumo and Sub-Chief Chilowoko.

(b) Ntchisi East

The eastern part of Ntchisi District comprising the areas of Chief Kasakula, Chief Chikho and Sub-Chief Nthondo.

DOWA

Number of Registered Voters - 146,919

27. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the Leaders. The leaders gave various suggestions as regards the demarcation of the new constituency. Some leaders favoured that the central constituency should comprise the whole area of Chief Msakambewa, that of Sub-Chief Chiponda and the area in Chief Dzoole known as Dzoole East including the Boma area from Kasangadzi River then following Bwantaka River to Themba then to a straight line joining the main Mponela road through Mbzanzi Malawi Young Pioneer Training Base. The eastern constituency would then comprise the area of Chief Chiwere

excluding the Township but would also include part of Sub-Chief Mkukula. Other leaders favoured that the constituency should comprise the area from Lumbadzi River following Dowa road to Ntchisi road up to Dzeleka then from Chilewa to Kasangadzi River, Mkwakwala River and Madisi Trading Centre to Mtiti River up to Mtengowanthenga.

28. Having taken all the arguments into consideration, we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Dowa District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Dowa West

The western part of Dowa District comprising the areas of Chief Dzoole, Sub-Chief Chakhaza, Sub-Chief Kayembe but excluding the Dzoole East Council Ward.

(b) Dowa Central

The central part of Dowa District comprising the remaining eastern part of Chief Dzoole's area, the whole area of Chief Msakambewa, the Boma area starting from Kasangadzi River following Bwantaka to Themba River up to the Boma Hills including the western part of the area of Sub-Chief Mkukula.

(c) Dowa East

The eastern part of Dowa District comprising the areas of Chief Chiwele and the eastern part of Sub-Chief Mkukula.

SALIMA

Number of Registered Voters - 84,420

29. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the Leaders. The leaders gave various suggestions for the demarcation of the new constituency boundary. However the leaders pointed out to us that there exist some disputes over District boundaries between Salima and Dowa Districts and they felt that these disputes should be settled in order to ensure that the work of Members of Parliament should be carried out efficiently.

30. As the matter of District boundaries does not come within our terms of reference we were informed by both the Regional Minister and the District Commissioner that the matter was being dealt with administratively. Having considered the arguments we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the new constituencies in Salima District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Salima North

The northern part of Salima District comprising the areas of Chief Khombedza, Sub-Chief Msosa and Sub-Chief Mwanza.

(b) Salima Central

The central part of Salima District comprising the areas of Chief Karonga, Chief Maganga and Chief Bibi Kuluunda.

(c) Salima South

The southern part of Salima District comprising the areas of Chief Ndindi, Sub-Chief Kambwiri, Chief Pemba and Sub-Chief Kambalame.

MCHINJI

Number of Registered Voters - 71,426

31. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the Leaders. The leaders gave various suggestions as regards the demarcation of the new constituency. Some leaders favoured that the new constituency should run from the road from Kasungu to Kochilila then to Kamwendo and Tembwe following the road to the border with Mozambique passing through Msuwilo and Gumuliro Village, while others suggested that the new constituency should run from the road from Kasungu to Kochilila then to Kamwendo and Tembwe and then following Chimimba Council Ward boundary to the border with Mozambique leaving Chimimba in the east.

32. Having taken all the arguments into consideration, we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Mchinji should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Mchinji North

The northern part of Mchinji District comprising Chief Mkanda's own administrative area and the area of Sub-Chief Dambe.

(b) Mchinji West

The western part of the Mchinji District comprising part of the area of Chief Mlonyeni near Namilolo Dam which forms a Council Ward and the whole area of Sub-Chief Mduwa.

(c) Mchinji East

The eastern part of Mchinji District comprising the whole area of Sub-Chief Mavwere.

(d) Mchinji South

The southern part of the Mchinji District comprising the whole area of Chief Zulu's own administration and the area of Chief Mlonyeni but excluding that Council Ward near the Namilolo Dam which forms part of the Mchinji Western constituency.

LILONGWE

Number of Registered Voters - 442,472

33. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the leaders. The leaders gave various suggestions regarding the demarcation of the new constituency boundaries.

34. Having taken all the arguments into consideration, we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Lilongwe District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Lilongwe North

The northern part of the Lilongwe District comprising the areas of Chief Chitukula and Chief Chimutu.

(b) Lilongwe City

The area of the City of Lilongwe as prescribed under the Townships Act, Cap. 96 including the whole area of the Capital City.

(c) Lilongwe West

The western part of Lilongwe District comprising the areas of Chiefs Kalolo, Khongoni and Kabudula.

(d) Lilongwe Central

The central part of Lilongwe District comprising the areas of Chiefs Chadzankwenda, Kalumba, Malili and Kalumbu but excluding the area under Sub-Chief Tsabango.

(e) Lilongwe East

The eastern part of Lilongwe District comprising the areas of Chief Mazengela, Sub-Chiefs Chitekwele and Tsabango.

(f) Lilongwe South

The southern part of Lilongwe District comprising the whole area of Chief Chiseka.

DEDZA

Number of Registered Voters - 246,257

35. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later had discussion with the leaders. The leaders gave various suggestions as regards the demarcation of the new constituency boundaries.

36. Having taken into consideration all the arguments, we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Dedza District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Dedza North

The northern part of Dedza District comprising the whole area of Chief Tambala.

(b) Dedza East

The eastern part of Dedza District comprising the whole area of Chief Kachindamoto.

(c) Dedza Central

The central part of Dedza District comprising the whole area of Chief Kaphuka, and the eastern part of the area of Chief Pemba which forms a District Council Ward.

(d) Dedza West

The western part of Dedza District comprising the whole area under Sub-Chief Chilikumwendo

and the area of Chief Pemba excluding the Council Ward which forms part of the Dedza Central Constituency.

(e) Dedza South

The southern part of Dedza District comprising the whole area of Chief Kasumbu and the area under Sub-Chief Kamenya Gwaza.

NTCHEU

Number of Registered Voters - 118,396

37. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the leaders. The leaders gave various suggestions as regards the demarcation of the new constituency boundaries.

38. Having considered all the arguments we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Ntcheu District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Ntcheu North

The northern part of the Ntcheu District comprising the areas of Chief Mambeya and Chief Masasa.

(b) Ntcheu Central

The central part of Ntcheu District comprising the whole area of Chief Njolomole and the remaining area of Chief Kwataine, but excluding the area surrounding the Boma which forms part of the western constituency.

(c) Ntcheu West

The western part of Ntcheu District comprising the whole area of Chief Mpando including the Boma area together with its neighbouring villages which form District Council Ward 14 in Chief Kwataine and the area under Village Headman Chabwera in Chief Phambala's area.

(d) Ntcheu South

The southern part of Ntcheu District comprising the areas of Chief Phambala and Sub-Chief Champiti but excluding the area under Village Headman Chabwera in Chief Phambala's area.

MANGOCHI

Number of Registered Voters - 162,288

39. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the leaders. The leaders gave various suggestions as regards the demarcation of the boundaries for the new constituency.

40. Having considered all the arguments we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Mangochi District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Mangochi West

The western part of Mangochi District comprising the whole area of Chief Namkumba.

(b) Mangochi Central

The central part of Mangochi District comprising the areas of Chiefs Mponda and Chimwala.

(c) Mangochi North

The northern part of Mangochi District comprising the whole areas of Chief Mekanjila, Sub-Chief Chowe and Sub-Chief Namabvi.

(d) Mangochi South

The southern part of Mangochi District comprising the whole areas of Chief Jalasi and Chief Katuli.

KASUPE

Number of Registered Voters - 194,664

41. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the leaders. The leaders gave various suggestions regarding the demarcation of the constituency.

42. Having considered the arguments we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Kasupe District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Kasupe North

The northern part of Kasupe District comprising the whole area of Chief Kalembo and a small area of Chief Msamala lying north of the Zomba/Lilongwe road including Balaka Township.

(b) Kasupe South

The whole area of Chief Msamala excluding that small part north of Zomba/Lilongwe road which forms part of the central constituency.

(c) Kasupe Central

The central part of Kasupe District comprising the areas of Chief Liwonde, Sub-Chiefs Mlomba, Sitola, Chamba, Mposa and including Liwonde Township area.

(d) Kasupe East

The eastern part of Kasupe District comprising the areas of Chiefs Nyambi, Kawinga, Sub-Chiefs Chiwalo, Ngokwe and Chikwewo.

ZOMBA

Number of Registered Voters - 198,567

43. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the leaders. The leaders gave various suggestions as regards the demarcation of the new constituency boundaries.

44. Having taken all the arguments into consideration we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Zomba District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Zomba North

The northern part of Zomba District comprising the whole areas of Chiefs Malemia, Kuntumanji and including the Zomba Township's area.

(b) Zomba East

The eastern part of Zomba District comprising the whole area of Chief Mwambo.

(c) Zomba West

The western part of Zomba District comprising the whole area of Chief Mlumbe.

(d) Zomba South

The southern part of Zomba District comprising the whole area of Chief Chikowi and the area under Sub-Chief Mbiza.

CHIRADZULU

Number of Registered Voters - 95,770

45. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the leaders. The leaders gave various suggestions regarding the splitting of the District into two constituencies.

46. Having considered the arguments we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Chiradzulu District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Chiradzulu North

The northern part of Chiradzulu District comprising the areas of Chiefs Mchema, Chitera, Mpama and including small areas of Chiefs Kadewere and Likoswe lying south of the Chilembwe road.

(b) Chiradzulu South

The southern part of Chiradzulu District comprising the area of Chief Mkalo and the remaining areas of Chief Kadewere and Chief Likoswe. The boundary between the two constituencies being along the Chilembwe road.

BLANTYRE

Number of Registered Voters - 196,151

47. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the leaders. The leaders gave various proposals as regards the demarcation of the new constituency boundary.

48. Having taken all the arguments into consideration we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in the Blantyre District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Blantyre North

The northern part of Blantyre District comprising the whole areas of Chiefs Chigaru, Lundu, Makata

and parts of the areas of Chiefs Machinjili, Kapeni and Kuntaja which are outside the City boundary excluding the Council Ward along Mitsidi Hill.

(b) Blantyre West

The western part of Blantyre District comprising the area of Chief Kunthembwe and the southern part of Chief Somba which is outside the City boundary and including Mitsidi Council Ward.

(c) Blantyre City East

The eastern part of the City of Blantyre within the City boundary comprising the areas of Limbe, Soche Hill College, Kanjedza and all the areas east of the road from Ndirande Mountain joining Makata Road, Mudi Dam to be in the east, then Kwacha Road to Soche Hill. Outside the City boundary to include the eastern part of the area of Chief Somba, known as Soche area and part of the area of Chief Machinjili comprising the areas of Village Headmen Anderson, Mpoto, Namtoka, Wasiri and Chauwa.

(d) Blantyre City Centre

The central part of the City of Blantyre within the City boundary, comprising the following areas of Blantyre West:- Soche, Zingwangwa, Sunny-Side, Namiwawa, Nyambadwe,

Ndirande, West of the road from Ndirande Mountain joining Makata road, Mudi Dam to be in the East, then following Kwacha road to Soche Hill. The boundary to follow a straight line to the confluence of Makalanga and Lunzu Streams (Village Headman Robert to be in the West) from the confluence of Makalanga and Lunzu Streams to the next confluence of Lunzu and Maone Streams then from the confluence of Lunzu and Maone Streams eastwards to Chileka road passing Nkhumbwe School in Chief Kapeni's area, joining the main Blantyre/Chileka road at the Dipping Tank straight to Michiru Hills then Mitsidi Mission Station to follow the Chief's boundary joining the area between Chiefs Somba and Kuntaja, including the western part of Chief Somba known as Ntonda area.

#### MWANZA

Number of Registered Voters - 33,508

49. We first visited the District with a view to considering the adjustment of constituency boundaries. When we met the leaders in the District they told us that they regretted for not having requested for an additional constituency. They requested that consideration be given for an additional constituency. This request was brought to the attention of the Minister Responsible for Parliamentary Elections. The Minister has informed us that after due consideration Your Excellency has graciously agreed that Mwanza be given an additional constituency. We therefore went to Mwanza for the third time to meet leaders on the question of how the three constituencies should be demarcated. After considering all the views of the leaders it is our recommendation to Your Excellency that constituencies in Mwanza be delimited as follows:-

(a) Mwanza East

The eastern part of Mwanza District comprising the areas of Chief Symon and Chief Ngozi.

(b) Mwanza Central

The central part of Mwanza District comprising the areas of Chief Dambe and Chief Mlauli.

(c) Mwanza West

The western part of Mwanza District comprising the areas of Chief Nthache and Chief Kanduku.

THYOLO

Number of Registered Voters - 169,497

50. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the leaders. The leaders gave various suggestions regarding the demarcation of the new constituency boundary.

51. Having considered the arguments, we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Thyolo District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Thyolo North

The northern part of Thyolo District comprising the whole areas of Chiefs Bvumbwe and Thomas and a small part of Chief Chimaliro's area known as Chimvu District Council Ward.

(b) Thyolo Central

The central part of Thyolo District comprising the whole areas of Chiefs Ngamwane, Mchilamwera and the area of Chief Chimaliro excluding Chimvu District Council Ward.

(c) Thyolo South

The southern part of Thyolo District comprising the whole areas of Chiefs Nsabwe and Changata.

MULANJE

Number of Registered Voters - 279,153

52. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the leaders. The leaders gave various suggestions regarding the demarcation of the new constituency boundaries.

53. Having considered all the arguments, we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Mulanje District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Mulanje East

The eastern part of Mulanje District comprising the area of Sub-Chief Njema and part of the area of Chief Nazombe up to ~~the~~ Mauzi swamp.

(b) Mulanje North

The northern part of Mulanje District comprising the remaining area of Chief Nazombe and the whole area of Chief Mkhumba.

(c) Mulanje West

The western part of Mulanje District comprising the areas of Chief Mkanda and Chief Mthilamanja and the area of Chief Chikumbu but excluding Chikumbu South Council Ward.

(d) Mulanje South

The southern part of Mulanje District comprising the whole area of Chief Mabuka including Chikumbu South Council Ward.

CHIKWAWA

Number of Registered Voters - 125,237

54. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the leaders. The leaders gave various suggestions as regards the demarcation of the new constituency boundaries.

55. Having considered all the arguments we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that constituencies in Chikwawa District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Chikwawa East

The eastern part of Chikwawa District comprising the areas of Chiefs Makuwira, Maseya, Katunga and Kasisi including the Boma area.

(b) Chikwawa West

The western part of Chikwawa District comprising the area of Chief Chapananga.

(c) Chikwawa South

The southern part of Chikwawa District comprising the area of Chief Ngabu.

NSANJE

Number of Registered Voters - 86,946

56. We first visited the area of the proposed new constituency and later held discussion with the leaders. The leaders gave various suggestions regarding the demarcation of the new constituency boundaries.

57. Having considered all the arguments we wish to recommend to Your Excellency that the constituencies in Nsanje District should be delimited as follows:-

(a) Nsanje North

The northern part of Nsanje District comprising the whole area of Chief Mlolo including the Bangula District Council Ward in Sub-Chief Mbenje's area.

(b) Nsanje Central

The central part of Nsanje District comprising the whole area of Chief Tengani and the area under Sub-Chief Mbenje but excluding the Bangula District Council Ward.

(c) Nsanje South

The southern part of Nsanje District comprising the areas of Chiefs Malemia, Chimombo, Ndamera, Nyachikadza, Ngabu and Sub-Chief Makoko.

TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE DELIMITATION  
OF CONSTITUENCIES BY THE ELECTORAL COM-  
MISSION

1. In the delimitation of constituencies the Commission shall have regard to:-
  - (a) The number of persons registered as voters in any registration district.
  - (b) The area it comprises.
  - (c) The ease of communications within the registration district or sub-district.
  - (d) The feelings of the people in any registration or sub-district.
2. The purposes of delimitation of constituencies are:-
  - (a) To increase the existing constituencies from 63 to 86.
  - (b) To conduct a review of the existing constituency boundaries of a selected administrative districts.
  - (c) That each constituency shall return a single Member to the National Assembly.
  - (d) That each constituency shall comprise a single area of the country by that may include adjacent island.
  - (e) That each constituency shall, as far as possible be so delimited as to comprise one or more registration sub-districts and unless there are special reasons to the contrary no sub-district shall be divided between constituencies.
  - (f) That constituencies shall in general be delimited to conform to the boundaries of administrative districts

and unless there are special reasons to the contrary, the constituency boundary shall not transgress the boundary of an administrative district.

- (g) That in describing the constituency the Commission shall list the Chiefs' and Sub-Chiefs' areas to be contained in each constituency.

3. The Commission shall not question the accuracy of any boundary described, or map of any registration district or sub-district if the Registration Officer of that district, the District Chairman of the Malawi Congress Party, the Chairman of the District Council and the Chiefs for that District certify that the boundaries of such District or sub-district are well known to the inhabitants thereof.
